Policy Summit - Oct 6th - SAVE THE DATE!

"Ending Violence Against Women - Making it Happen in LA". Once again, SILA is working with Business and Professional Women International (BPWI) and the American Association of University Women California (AAUW) to put on a one day summit on Tuesday, October 6, 2009 at The California Endowment to address violence against women. This event is



a follow up to the first summit which was held on March 12, 2008. Last year's summit attracted over 230 participants from law enforcement, nonprofit agencies, policy makers, and business organization.

According to **Julie Mairs**, this year's summit will feature two plenary speakers, four workshops, lunch and an afternoon session to address domestic and intimate partner violence (IPV). The Project Five-O-Los Angeles collaborative is working to develop a program that will build knowledge and public awareness of approaches and circumstances important to effective victim safety planning, learning from death review what can help to prevent homicides of women in violent intimate and domestic partner relationships, reaching "hidden" victims of IPV, and efforts at the community level to develop neighborhoods that are stable and safe.

Continuing Education Units will be sought for social workers and nurses. The fee for the day, including lunch, is \$45.00. Parking is free. Program hours are 7:30am to 3:00pm. All SILA members are encouraged to attend and to assist with check-in, note taking, and other logistical activities. Registration will open 30 days prior to the event.
