Some of you may remember **Laxmi Parasuram** when she visited our area last June through a Soroptimist Friendship Grant. She is now SI South Kolkata's correspondent for Friendship Links and is as enthusiastic about linking with us as we are with them.

SoroptImist International of South Kolkata (formally known as Calcutta), our potential new Friendship Link, is a strong advocate for girls and women, supporting and sponsoring many varied programs:

- For the last few years, SISK has been running a communication and personality development class for 35 underprivileged children; these classes provide a number of fun communication activities such as participating in plays, skits, group songs and occasional outings.
- SISK adopted the Free Primary School in South Kolkata; members visited the school, talked with the headmistress and subsequently contributed money to cover five teacher salaries and provide snacks for 65 of the children.
- Ekbalpore, a town in South Kolkata, has a center that provides artificial limbs. SISK has donated 25,000 Rupee to provide limbs to the poor and needy with emphasis on women.

By adding South Kolkata to our Friendship Link we achieve one of new **President Ginger's** goals for the coming year.

The mission of BEYOND SPORT is to align large and resource-rich sport corporations with not-forprofit and other non-govermental organization agencies seeking to administer critical sport programming in developing countries or among under-resourced communities in developed countries. To advance this goal, Beyond Sport has an annual application process for proposals to be submitted in order to be awarded a \$15,000 prize AND a year of free mentoring and technical support offered by one of the global premiere management firms.

There were over 450 applications for this year's competition The 10-12 board members had an enormous job to whittle the group down to about 30 'short-list' applicants. Even the short-list organizations who do not eventually win are flown to a BEYOND SPORT 4-day technical conference, this December in Capetown, South Africa. Final winners are selected by the Trustees (Ambassadors) of BEYOND SPORT, headed up by Tony Blair. Applications described amazing programs using all sorts of sport forms to achieve success in topical areas such as social inclusion, conflict resolution, education, health, environmental concern and Judges Awards for Innovation and Leadership.
