
Calling all SILA members - and prospective new members who are reading this Newsletter!

International Day of the Girl Child - October 11



On December 19, 2011, the United Nations declared October 11 as the International Day of the Girl Child. Its mission is "to help galvanize worldwide enthusiasm for goals to better girls' lives, providing an opportunity for them to show leadership and reach their full potential."

Girls face discrimination and violence every day across the world. The International Day of the Girl Child focuses attention on the need to address the challenges girls face and to promote girls' empowerment and the fulfillment of their human rights.

This year's theme is focused on "Innovating for Girls' Education". There is overwhelming evidence that girls' education, especially at the secondary level, is a powerful transformative force for societies and girls themselves: it is the one consistent positive determinant of practically every desired development outcome, from reductions in mortality and fertility, to poverty reduction and equitable growth, to social norm charge and democratization.

The 2013 International Day of the Girl Child will address the importance of new technology, but also innovation in partnerships, policies, resource utilization, community mobilization, and most of all, the engagement of young people themselves.

Report from South Kolkata

SILA has a Friendship Link with SI South Kolkata (SISK). **Laxmi Parasuram**, whom many SILA members have met on her visits to LA, recently shared the following update on Kolkata (Calcutta), SISK's activities, and her family:

"Here we are in this huge behemoth of an old city buzzing with too many people and various activities. Our annual Puja (a religious holiday) will be in two weeks and this brings the city to a high pitch.



Our Soroptimist Club of South Kolkata has been active. We arranged a cancer scan (cervical) for several poor women in diagnostic centre, distributed new clothes to children, and took them for an outing while conducting our regular Saturday classes. Our friendship link from Dundee will visit us in November and there will be some programs with her. We also celebrated our charter anniversary on the 21st and honored two well-known women.

My husband's 87th birthday was celebrated on September 29 with our many friends and the house has loads of flowers."
