Report on Fall Workshop

"Increased Collective Impact" was the theme of the 2013 Fall Workshop hosted by SI Glendale on October 12. Speakers included SIA President **Cheri Fleming** who is a member of SI Greater Santa Clarita Valley, **Linda Haines**, Governor of Camino Real Region who is a member of SI Downey, and SILA's **Ginger Cole** who is currently Camino Real Region Secretary. Every speaker spoke about increasing Soroptimists collective impact, be it through programs, fundraising, public awareness, social media and websites, and membership.

October was Domestic Violence Awareness Month.
One of our partner organizations, Peace Over Violence (SILA will be working with them at the upcoming Girltopia event), launched Post Over Violence, an interesting grassroots campaign aimed at promoting domestic violence awareness, education and support - all using post-its.

Post-its are commonly used as a quick and convenient way to leave someone a message or to remind someone of something important. For Demestic Violence Awareness Month, POV thought: why not use postits as a way

to leave our message and remind people of the importance of breaking the silence and raising awareness around domestic violence?

POV invited their volunteers, staff, and the community to use post-in notes as mini canvases to write messages about domestic violence then post them anywhere and everywhere to raise awareness, break myths, and create meaningful conversations about domestic violence. Participants were then encouraged to post pictures on social media pages and include the twitter hashtag #postoverviolence.
