Joyce Jacob, Chair of the Ruby Award, was pleased to introduce Lisa Watson, CEO of the Downtown Women's Center, as SILA's 2014 Ruby Award Winner.

The award honors a local woman who has made a difference in the lives of women and children. In her 15 years at DWC, she has set the strategic direction of the organization, overseeing a tremendous growth in programming (from 1000 to 4300 women served per year), budget (from \$500,000 to \$6,500,000) and staffing (from 10 to 65 staff).

Two SILA Graduate Fellowships Awarded

Through the added generousity of its membership, SILA was pleased to recognize TWO Graduate Fellowship award winner for 2014-15. Fellowship Chair **Joan Johnson** was pleased to announce this year's Fellowship Award was named the DeAnna Blaylock Graduate Fellowship in honor of long-time SILA member, **DeAnna Blaylock**.

Rachel Berry has completed her undergraduate degree (BFA in TV and Broadcast Journalism from Chapman University, Magna Cum Laude) with all her education loans paid off. She is now attending Fuller Theological Seminary working toward a Master of Arts degree in Theology and Ministry which she plans to finish in 2015. After winning the Miss City of Orange Scholarship Pageant, she made over 100 appearances speaking at local Girl Scout troops, Rotary Clubs, schools, and working on behalf of her platform, Girls, Inc., an organization with a mission of promoting self esteem among at risk adolescent girls.


Joan Johnson was honored for 35 years of Soroptimist membership and **Sheila** for 30 years of membership.
